

ERRATUM to the SBA survey report 2006:

In the abstract to the full report, in relation to forage it is stated that sycamore is significantly more often cited in the West area. In fact this is true of rosebay willow herb, rather than sycamore, as will be seen from the tables in the report.

In relation to swarming, it is stated that "Slightly over 50% of respondents used bait hives to try to attract swarms in both 2004 and 2005, the practice being more common in the Aberdeen and North areas. Of those using this technique, 42% were successful in attracting swarms in 2004, and 38% in 2005." In fact this should read

"Slightly over 50% of respondents used bait hives to try to attract swarms in both 2004 and 2005, the practice being more common in the Aberdeen and North areas. Of those using this technique, 58% were successful in attracting swarms in 2004, and 62% in 2005." Again this should be clear from the tables in the report itself.
